







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Block #5 Part #1 - Cutting Requirements for FIVE (5) "Star Gardner" Quilt Blocks



"Star Gardner"
Quilt Block
Make a total of FIVE (5)

Mr. Blue Sky - Color #20	Cut FIVE (5) 3 1/2" squares.
The Ocean - Color #22	Cut TWENTY (20) 2 1/2" squares.
Purple Haze - Color #18	Cut TEN (10) 3" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You'll end up with TWO (2) triangles per square.
After Midnight - Color #23	Cut TWENTY (20) 2 1/2" squares.
Deep Purple - Color #19	Cut TWENTY (20) 3" squares. On the back side of the squares draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time.
Natural Mystic - Color #21	Cut TWENTY (20) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
Bell Bottom Blues - Color #24	Cut TWENTY (20) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
Black - Color #6	Cut TWENTY (20) 3" squares.
Black - Color #6	Cut FORTY (40) 3" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You'll end up with TWO (2) triangles per square.
Black - Color #6	Cut EIGHTY (80) 2 1/2" squares. On the back side of the squares draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time.

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Block #5 Part #1 - Piecing the "Star Gardner" Quilt Blocks Together



"Star Gardner"

Make a total of FIVE (5)

Half-Square Triangle (HST) Tutorial

Place the Deep Purple 3" (Color #19) square on the Black (Color # 6) 3" square (right sides together) and sew 1/4" on EACH SIDE of the line you drew (shown in yellow in Figure #1). Then cut the Half-Square Triangles apart ON the line you drew (shown in red in Figure #1).



Red line = Drawn line & cutting line

Yellow dashed line = Sew 1/4" on EACH

SIDE of the drawn line

You'll end up with TWO (2) Half-Square Triangles (Figure #2). Press toward the darkest fabric. Then trim them down to <u>2 1/2" square</u>. You need to make a total of <u>FORTY (40)</u> HST's out of the Deep Purple 3" (Color #19) & Black (Color # 6) fabrics.

<u>Quilt Note</u>: When making HST's, try cutting your squares 1/4" or 1/2" larger than the pattern calls for, then trim them down to the exact size needed for your quilt block.

Square in a Square Tutorial

You'll see in my "Cutting Instructions" to cut some squares ONE (1) time, diagonally, corner-to-corner. There will also be a larger square associated with it. When piecing a portion of a quilt block that calls for a Square in a Square follow the diagram (Figure #1) first.



Then follow the diagram (Figure #2) second.

Press in the direction of the arrows.

You need to make a total of <u>FIVE (5)</u> Square In a Square portion's for all FIVE (5) of the "Star Gardner" Quilt Blocks.

This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) to see if you get the correct block size.

Flying Geese Tutorial

This is an alternate way to make a traditional Flying Geese. It's more like making Snowball Corners. You'll see in my "Cutting Instructions," to draw a line on the back side of some fabrics (shown in red in Figures #1 & #2), corner-to-corner.

With right sides together, line up the smaller square so that it is <u>perfectly</u> even with the corner & sides of the rectangular piece. Then you'll sew <u>ON</u> the line you drew (shown in <u>red</u> in Figure #2) & cut off the corner 1/4" from the line you sewed (shown in <u>green</u> in Figure #2 below). Press toward the darkest color. You need to make a total of <u>TWENTY (20)</u> Flying Geese out of Natural Mystic (Color #21) & Black (Color #6).






Repeat this same process for the opposite corner (Figure #3). Then repeat the <u>entire</u> process using the Bell Bottom Blues (Color #24) & the Black (Color #6) fabrics! You need to make a total of TWENTY (20) Flying Geese out of Bell Bottom Blues (Color #24) & Black (Color #6).




After you've sewn the Half-Square Triangles, the Flying Geese & the Square in a Square's together, the "Star Gardner" quilt blocks sew together just like a Nine-Patch quilt block does!




