## Scrappy Square Quilt Sew-In

So far there are 30 signed up for the workshop. The location and date are to be determined.

This contemporary scrap quilt requires  $800 - 2\,\%''$  squares. In conjunction with the project, a swap of  $2\,\%''$  squares will be made among the participants so that everyone will have 800 different  $2\,\%''$  squares. For those who wish to participate in the swap, they will select 50 fabrics from their stash and cut one  $2\,\%''$  strip width of fabric (WOF). The WOF is then cut into  $2\,\%''$  squares. Fifty WOF strips will yield  $800 - 2\,\%''$  squares. The squares will be handed-in a month prior to the session and redistributed to the participants. # **Quilt Challenge January 2020**





Our February meeting will be devoted to making pillowcases. A few members are bringing sewing machines and sergers, but we need plenty of help for non-sewing parts of the process. If you aren't familiar with the 'burrito' method of making pillowcases that we will be using, take a few minutes to watch the following YouTube video that shows how it is done.

We'll also collect any pillowcases you've made at home. Remember to wash the completed pillowcases in unscented detergent. Some of the kids have a bad reaction to

scents. If you don't have unscented detergent, simply return the unwashed pillowcases to me and I will see that they are washed and packaged. Thanks.

In 2019 the guild members made so many blocks for a veteran's quilt that we had enough to make a quilt in 2019 and also one for 2020. Therefore, for our veteran's project this year, we'll be contributing to the national Quilts of Valor 2020 Block Drive, where they are hoping to collect 20,000 9-patch blocks. The link below has instructions and fabric requirements for the 12-inch 9-patch block that they are requesting.
