December's Potluck Potpourri Review:

Thank you to all who came out for our December meeting. Despite a few technical glitches, it really was a night filled with a potpourri of fun, music, and laughter. The Silent Auction was a huge success! Fifteen members and two non-members contributed items and eighteen winning bids produced \$858.50 toward future guild programming.

January 2021: – And the winner is...? Flying Geese Challenge Event. We'll know at the beginning of our January 5 meeting who the winners are in each category. Judy Walker, our Challenge Chairperson, sent out an email with voting instructions in mid-December. Please refer to her message or contact her directly if you still have questions.

January Workshop with Pam Hadfield is on schedule. We have ten participants for this two-day event. It will be the Crazy Quilters' first attempt at a virtual workshop. Stay tuned for an update on how that process went as well as see some finished projects in February.



February 2021: – Pillowcase Palooza. Community Service at its best! Thank you to everyone who stopped by Holy Spirit to drop off and pickup pillowcases from Janet Y. in December. I know that I had a lot of fun choosing some to create! We will be blessed with **TWO programs this evening.** Michelle Banton will join us at 7:00 PM to provide a lecture on "Cotton to Consumer." Her presentation will tie in nicely by giving us the background of the materials we use to create the items we donate. In addition, Janet and Mercedes will follow up with a short presentation highlighting the various community service projects we support. You won't want to miss it!

March 2, 2021: – Toni Smith, AKA Quiltoni, will do a presentation on the pixel revolution. **Toni will offer our second workshop of the year.** She will teach us how to create our own pixelated patterns. A six-hour workshop spread across two days will be held on Saturday, March 6 and Saturday, March 13. Both sessions will run from 1:00 – 4:00. Cost is \$25 per member. Class size is limited to 30 attendees. **Registration deadline for this workshop is February 2, 2021.** Registration forms will be forwarded in a separate email.

April 2021: – Dr. Leo McCormick and staff will present a lecture on Ergonomics for Quilters.

We are hoping that with the availability of a COVID-19 vaccine and warmer weather, we'll be able to host this one live!

May 2021: – Heather Kojan returns and will share her tips for deciphering Quilt Math.

June 2021: - Mary Fons (of Fons and Porter) will do a trunk show and share her experience as editor of *Quiltfolk* Magazine.

July 2021: – Cindy Orvacez, author of *Into the Garden: Realistic Three Dimensional Flowers Faster by the Strip* will talk to us about using embellishments in our designs.

August 2021: – Special **two-hour** presentation with Emily Taylor who will teach us the basics of collage quilting.

October 2021: - Robin Long of Robin Ruth Designs will do a program on creating the Mariner's Star using her strip piecing method.

I want to thank all of the members who have been forwarding names of suggested speakers to me. It helps me determine what topics you are interested in as well as what skills you'd like to learn. Keep the leads coming! What was particularly interesting to me is to see how many of us share the same interests.

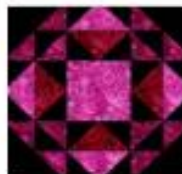

How did you learn how to sew?

My mother taught me to use her sewing machine when I was approx.. 12 yrs. old. I continued with lessons in home economics classes in Jr. & Sr. High. When my grandmother would visit during summer months she would teach me various embroidery techniques.

How would you describe your quilting style?

Bright, bold and sassy!

Has it changed over time?

I haven't been quilting long enough to know yet. I suspect it might.

Who is your favorite fabric designer and why?

Currently – Robert Kaufman. I love the colors! They are bright, but not obnoxious!

Do you pick fabric or pattern first?

So far it's been a toss up. My first quilt and one challenge I had fabric and picked the pattern. My current (2nd) quilt and another challenge piece, I had the pattern and then chose the fabric.

What is your favorite part about quilt making and why?

Sewing the quilt top! I love watching it come together.

What is your least favorite part and why?

Measuring and cutting the fabric. I'm always afraid I'm going to mess it up.

What other things do you sew?

Machine – pillowcases, bags, pin cushions. By hand – counted cross stitch pictures and Christmas ornaments as well as pin cushions.

What is your favorite sewing saying?

My overall favorite saying is "There's nothing to it but to do it", so the closest sewing saying would probably be "Finished is better than perfect".

What other hobbies do you enjoy?

Reading, playing piano, baking, crocheting, crafting.

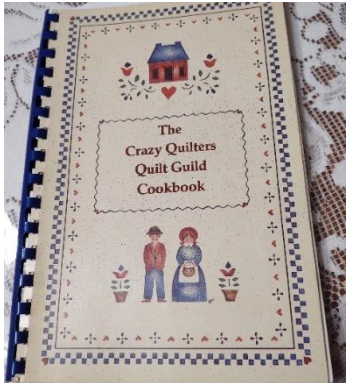

RECALLING RECIPES: FROM THE CRAZY QUILTERS QUILT GUILD COOKBOOK

CHICKEN IN SAUCE

1 pkg. onion soup mix, 1- 8 oz jar apricot preserves, 1 jar Kraft or Wish-one Red Russian dressing, chicken pieces

Mix all ingredients together and pour over chicken pieces. Marinate 1 hour. Bake at 350 for 1 hour, covered, and ½ to ¾ hour, uncovered.

SPICY BAKED SHRIMP

2cloves garlic, peeled and minced, 1/4 C margarine,1 C. fine bread crumbs, ½ tsp. dried thyme,1/2 tsp. freshly grated orange peel, Pinch of cayenne pepper, dash of salt, 2 lbs shelled raw shrimp, 3 T. white wine

Preheat oven to 350 and grease shallow casserole dish. Saute garlic in margarine until garlic is pale gold in color. Remove saute pan from heat and add bread crumbs and seasonings. Mix thoroughly. Spread shrimp evenly in casserole dish. Sprinkle with crumb mix and add wine. Bake for 15 minutes.

MEXICAN CASSEROLE

1 lb ground beef, browned and drained, 1 can pinto beans, 1 pkg. taco seasoning mix, 1 to 1 ½ C. shredded Monterey Jack or Coly cheese, sour cream, about 2 C, tortilla chips (more or less to taste), shredded lettuce, chopped tomatoes, salsa

Stir taco seasoning over ground beef that has been browned and drained. Follow the directions on the taco seasoning package. In a large casserole dish layer the meat, beans, and tortilla chips on top. Cover with cheese and bake at 350 for 20 to 25 minutes. Casserole should be heated through and cheese melted. Garnish with chopped lettuce and tomatoes and serve with salsa and sour cream.
