July 6, 2021: Did you ever look at a piece of fabric and think to yourself, "This piece just needs something."? Join us at 7:00 PM when author Cindy Orvacez will share several different ways to embellish your quilts and quilted objects to give your pieces an extra dimension.

August 2021: PLEASE NOTE – there is a slight change for this month. Emily Taylor will present a one-hour lecture on Tuesday, August 3 to teach us what collage quilts are, how they are made and her journey to becoming a collage quilt artist! Cautions about the pattern for this block:


- 1. There are 2 patterns Part 1 and Part 2.

 I found NO place in this block to use these 40 3" squares. Also, the setting diagram at the bottom of Page 5 is incorrect.
- In Part 2 I followed the picture on page 3 (shown as #5) for my setting diagram.
- 4. You may want to make a test block when you start.

Please let me know if you find mistakes or have questions when working on this block.

Quilt Journey

I have one entry for the newsletter for a quilt journey this month. Please fill out and email. I hope to have entries for a few more months so fill it out today!

Name: Sarah Jay Length of Quilt Journey: 6 years

How did you learn how to sew?

My mother's sewing machine lived in our dining room and she taught me to use it (after mastering hand-sewing and counted cross stitch) when I was about 10 years old. She gave me my first machine when I got my first real apartment in college so I could sew and mend clothes, make curtains, and design costumes.

How would you describe your quilting style?

My style is all over the place! As a relatively new quilter, I'm trying as many styles as I can, but they tend to skew modern. Most of my quilts are scrappy.

Has it changed over time?

It changes with almost every quilt! MQG guild bees have forced me out of my comfort zone and given me opportunities to try advanced blocks and styles I never would have chosen on my own.

Who is your favorite fabric designer and why?

I love the designers of Ruby Star Society (formerly Cotton + Steel), but thrifted fabric and other people's scraps are my favorite source.

Do you pick fabric or pattern first?

I almost always pick the fabric first. I mix and match fabric bundles from my stash just for the joy of it and so that I have jumping off points ready to go when I find a new pattern.

What is your favorite part about quilt making and why?

It's a toss up between sifting through hundreds (thousands?!) of fabric possibilities and seeing the finished blocks come together on my design wall. I have a background in newspaper design, from back when things were still pasted together by hand for the printer, and I still thrill at fitting all the little pieces into something more powerful. The pieces are fabric now, instead of copy and photos.

What is your least favorite part and why?

I dread pressing. A wool mat has made such a positive difference in my blocks that I don't hate it quite as much as I used to though.

What other things do you sew? Clothes, costumes, bags, pillows

What is your favorite sewing saying? Measure twice, cut once.

What other hobbies do you enjoy? Card making, reading, baking, photography, beading



Planning to travel by plane this summer or later? Recent rules regarding quilting supplies allowed on the plane:

As of May 2021, the <u>Travel Security Association (TSA</u>) allows many sewing-related items in carry-on luggage. Ultimately, TSA agents have the final say in what can be carried onto a plane, so it is a good idea to travel with cheaper notions in case you have to part with them.

Some airports have mail service, so you can also bring a padded envelope and stamps in your carry-on luggage in order to mail back any items that are not allowed through security (you will need to step out of line, so be sure to plan enough time for this).

RECALLING RECIPES: FROM THE CRAZY QUILTERS QUILT GUILD COOKBOOK

GARDEN EGG SALAD

½ c. mayonnaise or salad dressing 1/3 c. sweet relish
½ tsp. celery salt
½ tsp. instant minced onion
8 hard cooked eggs, chopped
1 (10oz) bag frozen peas
¼ c. chopped celery
lettuce leaves (optional)

In medium bowl stir together mayonnaise, relish, celery salt, and minced onions until blended. Toss with eggs, peas, and celery until combined. Cover and chill to blend flavors. Serve on lettuce leaves

MARINATED FLANK STEAK OR LONDON BROIL

½ c. soy sauce
2 T. honey
2T. vinegar
1 tsp ginger spice
sprinkle of garlic powder
¼ c. oil

Mix all ingredients. Marinate at least 4 to 6 hours, the longer the better. Makes enough marinate approx. 2 lbs. of meat.

FRESH STRAWBERRY PIE

1 baked pie shell ¹/₂ Qt. strawberries, crushed 1 c. sugar 1 T. butter 1 Qt. strawberries, washed and hulled 2 ¹/₂ T. cornstarch ¹/₂ c. water whipped cream (optional)

Spread whole berries in pie shell. In a saucepan mix crushed berries, sugar, water, and cornstarch and boil for about 2 min. until glaze is clear. Remove from heat and add butter. You may also add 2 drop of food coloring if you wish. Pour the glaze over the berries in the pie shell. Chill and keep refrigerated. Before serving top with whipped cream.
