There are many YouTube videos on easy to make flying geese or a no waste flying geese pattern. Missouri Star has a "Take Flight" tutorial on their website.

The rules are you need to have at least 30 flying geese in your challenge quilt. You may have more, but the minimum is 30 and the quilt must have been finished in 2020.





Thankfully, the iron gave it to me straight and reminded me this will all be smoothed over soon.




Member News and Requests

Toiletries for Allentown School District Homeless Project



Notes from the March Quilters Studio on Batting – Carole Whaling and Sharon Yurkanin

Carole's batting of choice is Heirloom 80/20 but her number one tip is to read the packaging and use according to instructions.

To pre shrink she puts in washer and soaks but does not run thru cycle. Dry by air fluff only for about 2-5 minutes.

Another good choice is Dream Poly with pink label. It comes in white version for white guilt.

Warm and Natural or Warm and White is a good sturdy choice. Make sure you use the right side which is the side that the needle goes thru.

Quilters Dream Cotton is very thin.

To piece batting together, use walking foot with longest stitch. Use zig zag stitch and put pieces next to each other but not overlapping.

Sharon recommends a hedge hog needle puller. I found it just under the name 3 in 1 needle puller.
