At our January meeting, some ideas of items you can donate were provided. IF you have any kinds of items already, feel free to bring them along to any meeting. The baskets we will put together to entice folks to buy tickets to win them may be either sewing related or non-sewing related.

We will have some ideas to show you at our May meeting! Please know that Jane Merkel is heading this portion of the bingo and will accept tricky tray donations at any meeting. Just seek her out at any meeting! Believe me, the sky's the limit! Already, many quilts have been offered to us and we thank you all for your kind donations. Our current number of the donated quilts for Bingo is twelve and we need 25 by August 1st. I already know of at least 4 more that are in the midst of completion! The committee continues to meet each month and brings all of your suggestions to our discussion. Please note that we are more than open to using any of the Simple Whatnots that do not have homes already; we do have a few already! Tickets will be available for sign-out or purchase at our May meeting. My advice is DON'T WAIT TOO LONG because tickets could sell out quickly! Remember that pre-sale price is \$25.00. Should you have any questions at all, feel free to ask them at our May meeting and we will try our best to answer them. Again, since this will be our only fundraiser for 2023, we are hoping that it is really successful for our guild and YOU are the determining factor in that.

TRICKY TRAY THOUGHTS !

THE TRICKY TRAY PORTION OF OUR QUILT BINGO PARTY ADDS AN ADDITONAL FUND RAISING ELEMENT TO OUR SEPTEMBER 10, 2023, DAY. CARDS WITH 25-26 TICKETS USUSALLY SELL FOR \$10 EACH. IF THE ITEMS ARE APPEALING, THEY ENCOURAGE SALES ALL BY THEMSELVES.

WE ARE HOPING TO "CREATE" 25-30 BASKETS THAT WILL APPEAL TO OUR ATTENDEES. AS YOU WILL SEE FROM OUR SUGGESTIONS, THEY NEED NOT ALL BE QUILTER ORIENTED. THESE IDEAS WERE SUGGESTED TO ME OR THEY ARE ITEMS I HAVE SEEN AT OTHER TRICKY TRAY EVENTS. YOU NEED NOT SUPPLY ALL ITEMS FOR A BASKET, WE WILL GATHER WHAT YOU WANT TO DONATE AND THE COMMITTEE WILL FORMULATE THE BASKETS. EACH BASKET WILL BE TICKETED WITH THE ITEMS INCLUDED.

BASKET IDEAS:

1. Pamper Yourself (fragrant soap, aromatic scents, a loofah sponge, massage certificate etc.).

- 2. Pampered Chef items.
- 3. Entertainment Basket (tickets to a movie, play, or other local event).
- 4. Gardener's Basket (tools, lawn decorations, miracle grow, plants, etc.).
- 5. Wine and Cheese Basket
- 6. Healthy Basket (herbal teas, tea cups, napkins, honey, etc.)

7. Cookie Cutter Basket (all types of cookie cutters, ingredients for recipes, fancy molds etc.)

- 8. Children's Basket (coloring books, reading books, crayons, etc.)
- 9. Game Basket (any fun games, popcorn, etc.)
- 10. Patriotic Basket (fabric, flags, placemats, etc.)
- 11. Ideas for Quilting Baskets, themed by season (Christmas, Halloween) etc.

2023 Quilt Challenge -- Hearts

Rules for the Challenge:

Your quilt must have a heart somewhere on the front surface other than just in the quilting. It can be a heart or heart print fabric.

Quilt must be started during this calendar year-2023

The challenge is open to guild members only

There will be four (4) categories:

Large — (40X40 or larger)

Small — (less than 40X40)

Other — Wearable Art clothing, placemats, totes and bags, etc

Original — This is for any quilted item that is your original design and not purchased or otherwise copied from someone else. This is your opportunity to let your creativity shine.
