What do golf balls and Silly Puddy have in common? The 19 members who attended Dr. Leo McCormick's program at Lindberg Park on August 17 know! They are simple, commonsense tools used to exercise and relieve pain in tired feet and hands. Dr. Leo's engaging and fun program provided many insights and tips that will keep us all sewing longer and with less pain.

September 7, 2021: What better way to start off a new year than with a program centered on why we spend so much of our time creating things? Meg Cox will offer her thoughts on "Making Meaning." This meeting will be held by Zoom only. Due to the recent surge of Covid cases again, our meeting space at Holy Spirit is not available, so we will continue with our virtual only format.

We have had a FABULOUS year of our members' generosity of time, talent and treasure! Self taught. Thanks to the Sew4Home website!! I bought a house and wanted to make fun pillows and curtains. My grandma asked if I could take some embroidery squares and make it into a blanket for her. This was my first attempt at a quilt.

How would you describe your quilting style?

Modern and bright colors. I like large prints

Has it changed over time?

I've definitely learned more about what fabric works best and avoided buying certain kinds like directional prints.

Who is your favorite fabric designer and why?

Tula Pink! I love how she sneaks items in her fabric and her sense of humor.

Do you pick fabric or pattern first? Fabric. Pattern? What pattern? I make things up as I go or use a photo for inspiration.

What is your favorite part about quilt making and why?

The design process

What is your least favorite part and why?

100 of the same block. I do not like doing the same thing 100 times.

What other things do you sew?

I love making bags! They get done a lot faster than a quilt.

What is your favorite sewing saying?

"Nothing haunts you more than the fabric you didn't buy."

Also," I like big blocks and I cannot lie."

What other hobbies do you enjoy?

Baking, Walking the dogs and Bike rides.

Name: Karen Rush Length of Quilt Journey: 6 years

How did you learn how to sew?

I had sewing in Home Ec. in Jr. High where I made an apron. But most of my learning came from my mother who made all my pretty dresses when I was young. It was the era of mother/daughter dresses. Later she started making quilts and cloth dolls. I didn't think too much about wanting to quilt until I saw all her beautiful fabric. Then I was hooked because I knew I had to make good use of her stash.

How would you describe your quilting style?

Eclectic – I like a wide range of styles. It's whatever catches my eye whether it's a pattern I want to try or fabulous fabric.

Has it changed over time?

No. I'm still learning and there's so much I want to try.

Who is your favorite fabric designer and why?

I like the Gail Kessler Dimples line of fabric. The pattern is so versatile and such a wide selection of colors. Other than that it's whatever catches my eye.

Do you pick fabric or pattern first?

Depends. Sometimes I play with my fabrics (can't believe I just admitted that) and when I find pieces that will look good together, I try to figure out a pattern. Other times I'll see a pattern on Facebook or a quilting magazine and decide to try. Then I go to my stash (most I inherited from my Mom) and see what I have.

What is your favorite part about quilt making and why?

The binding because the quilt is almost finished.

What is your least favorite part and why?

Making the quilt sandwich. Takes me what seems like forever to get everything straight. I pin then see that I'm short on one side. Ugh! Well, that's not what I usually say.

What other things do you sew?

In the past I have made clothing, embroidered gifts and recently I discovered I enjoy hand applique, especially wool.

What is your favorite sewing saying?

If you can't see it from the back of a galloping horse, no one will notice.

What other hobbies do you enjoy?

Over the years I have done a little bit of everything; ceramics, cross-stitch, latch-hooking, crochet, scrapbooking, jewelry making. My basement looks like a hobby store!

Membership


We had 44 members attend our August 3rd meeting.
