Programs

April 2, 2024 – Patricia Belyae, "The Alluring World of Japanese Yukata Quilts" – Hybrid meeting.

Patricia Belyea made her first quilt at age 53 from garments purchased at Goodwill. She felt that she had found a home in quilting. She discovered yukata cottons during travels to Japan. A yukata is a lightweight, informal, Japanese kimono whose name translates to "bathing cloth". Yukata were historically worn to local bathhouses. Today, yukata are widely worn as casual summer garb. Modern yukata fabrics have strayed from the traditional indigo and white to lively multicolored designs. Patricia's Zoom lecture will lead us into "The Alluring World of Japanese Yukata Quilts." When not lecturing or teaching workshops, Patricia and her daughter Victoria Stone are the owners of Okan ("mom" in Japanese) Arts. Their West Coast business imports vintage textiles from Japan, runs quilting workshops, leads tours to Japan, and offers quilts by Patricia in its online gallery.









April 27, 2024 - WORKSHOP – Heather Blokzyl will teach Barn Quilt painting at Calvary. Three patterns will be available. \$50/person. All materials included. Live program only. July 2, 2024 - Brita Nelson, also known as "The Questioning Quilter," will do a live lecture, "Now You See It, Now You Don't: The Magic of Disappearing Blocks".

July 20, 2024 - WORKSHOP - Brita returns for a live, six-hour workshop — The Disappearing Block Sampler. At the end of the day, you will have completed nine blocks.
