Have you ever experienced a sense of helplessness when confronted with out of control, overflowing piles of scrap fabrics and good intentions? Have you had trouble making your way to your sewing machine? Does your work table look more like the island of misfit fabrics? If you're nodding your head "yes!", then Janellea Macbeth's upcoming lecture and workshop, "ScrapStastic Quilts, Organizing Your Scrap Fabric Stash and Actually Using it" is for you.

Janellea started sewing as a youngster, discovering quilting by age 9. She was a full-on fabric rescuer and collector by her early 20's, filling her sewing room to overflowing. In a desperate attempt to regain control she tried to give her fabric away - to no avail. She closed the door and walked away...until her mother dragged her to a quilt show. Intoxicating! Tempting! What to do now?



Janellea set some new ground rules for her relationship with fabric, captured in the phrase "If there be madness, let there be a method to it." Join us at the guild meeting on April 1 to learn more how she tamed her stash and re-energized her quilting endeavors. Sign up for her in person workshop on May 31 and you'll get some hands-on experience taming your own unruly stash.

Quilt Challenge 2025

The challenge this year will be to make a "Monochromatic" quilted piece. The definition of Monochromatic is having or consisting of one color or hue. You can use a variety of shades of a single color or hue. OR, you can

use black, white and grey. To make it more interesting you may optionally add one additional color. The added color may only be used in less than 10% of the piece. The fabrics used may be solid, blenders or patterns, but the overwhelming color in each fabric should be the selected monochromatic or added color.

For example, if you choose

- black, white, and gray, you could optionally add lime green in less than 10% of the piece
- teal, you could optionally add black in less than 10% of the piece
- red, you could optionally add white in less than 10% of the piece
- blue, you could optionally add orange in less than 10% of the piece

Note: to get more information on monochromatic color schemes, google the color you want to use, for example 'monochromatic red color schemes'

All entries will have a quilter's statement about the piece and must be completed between February 4 and December 27, 2025.

There will be four categories

- Large Quilt (40" X 40" or larger)
- Small Quilt (less than 40" X 40")
- Other (placemats, totes, garments. Wearable art, etc.)
- Original (any product, quilt or otherwise, that was not a purchased
 pattern created by someone else. This must come out of your own imagination. If your product was
 inspired by another creator, please give them credit).

Our Crazy About Quilts show is steadily moving along with guild members working on items to sell and with planning being handled by committees. Some of you have asked who the Chairs for committees are. I am the Chair of the show, so any questions can be addressed to me if you are not sure where to get an answer. The Quilt Display group is seeking people to sign up with them to white glove for a few hours at our event. For those of you who have never done this, white glovers keep people from touching the quilts. Members wearing white gloves (which our guild has) will, by guest request, lift a corner to show the quilt back and the quilting. At our show they will also be supervising any areas with displaying quilts to ensure no beverages or food comes into those areas. We will need 4-6 members to do this at all times where quilts are displayed. This is one of those jobs that is simply fun. You get to talk to visitors about the quilts, our guild, their guild, and answer their questions. Jane has calculated that we can display about 100 quilts. The committee will be putting a form out soon asking for a few of your quilts to be brought in for display at our show and information regarding each quilt.



I was delighted to see all the items members are working on for the boutique at our last guild meeting. Please continue to work on them and give Sharon Yurkanin your name with what you are or will be working on and how many you expect to have for boutique. I don't particularly enjoy doing a lot of the same item repeatedly unless it is a really fast thing to make, so with the table runner I am making, I will make one extra for boutique. I took my crochet dish cloths outside to sit in the sun and work on them while enjoying the warm weather and watching my bird feeders. They take about 30 minutes each- I have about a dozen of those dish cloths finished. What I am saying is that all of your efforts are greatly appreciated and that one of a kind or multiples of any item are fine. We are aiming for the table to be well-stocked and attractive.

Linda Johnson and I have been investigating getting a point of service credit card reader (like Clover, Square, or Kettle/Paypal) so we can do cashless transactions. If any member has had experience with the use of any point of service devices Linda would like to talk with you. Having the ability for cashless transactions to take membership dues and class registrations at our meetings, at this Quilt Show, and at any other future fund-raisers is a plus for those, like my kids, that never carry cash!

Julie McDonnell and her committee have emailed you our initial flyer. They have also put it up on our website. Make copies for yourself so that you can display them at your food store, bank, post office, gym, church, pizza shop, etc. whenever you think the time is right, but before the end of summer definitely. And make sure you check to make sure the poster is still up regularly once you post—some establishments take stuff down on a regular basis even before the event occurs. The more attendance we have equates to more people buying more items, and maybe more people joining our guild. It becomes a win/win for us and them.

Our Silent Auction will be discussed via a Zoom meeting to be held before our next guild meeting (6:30 pm on the 20th.) Cathleen Kilpatrick has under discussion exactly what will be displayed for Silent Auction and what will go into boutique or Quilter's cupboard areas. If you are planning to make a quilt or have a basket of items to donate, Cathleen needs to know about that. I am sure some clarification on this will occur during our next guild meeting. As well if you want to be part of this Zoom discussion, email Cathleen to receive an invitation.



Quilter's Cupboard should be items that we are shedding from our quilting rooms—the leftover blocks from a quilt already made; fat quarters, fabrics, nicknacks or bags of scraps you will not use; rulers that you used a few times but no longer need; books or magazines you no longer need. Get the picture? It is that stuff too good to toss into the trash but that stuff that persistently gets in your way. Any quilt kits that are complete but not made up will come under discussion for Silent Auction, the Cupboard, or Boutique sales. And likewise, any items made we will value and determine where they should go.

Please, block off on your calendar Oct 3rd and 4th. All hands on deck for set up—the more help we have the shorter the day becomes. If you have a mobility issue, we will gladly give you a job to do seated. We will need lots of help pricing items in boutique, silent auction, and cupboard and setting up their displays; hanging quilts for display, organizing demo rooms; putting up directional signs; and organizing admissions and checkout table, etc. On day of sale, we will need help in all areas for supervision, helping visitors, and for final take down. Calvary will need to be totally ready for its Sunday services before we leave on the 4th. More hands make the work go faster.

Thanks to so many of you who are making items for the guild to sell at the Crazy for Quilts Boutique. - 4. Think through all the materials you will need to bring and assemble them. This would include things like: sewing machine, thread, tools, fabric. It would be super inspiring if you could bring finished examples of the technique you are demonstrating to be displayed.
- 5. Show up at least 10 minutes before your assigned time.
- 6. Do your demonstration and answer any questions people might have.
- 7. Pat yourself on the back for a job well done!

See? This is absolutely something fun and inspiring that you can do. Please note that you will be doing a demonstration, not a hands-on class where you would have to make up kits and directions. We are keeping it simple.


