Is the summer flying by for all of you? It is for me. And Bingo is suddenly looming right around the corner. We had a meeting just last night regarding finalizing plans for September 10th. Here are the concerns we voiced:

- 1) We need to sell our 200 tickets. At this moment I have 55 paid tickets. I am expecting 4 more to be paid via mail this week. PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE if you are holding money turn it in to me at Sit and Sew on July 25 or at our meeting August 1. Also sell any tickets you possibly can. We want this Bingo to run smoothly with enough members present to make that happen.



Rules for the Challenge:

Your quilt must have a heart somewhere on the front surface other than just in the quilting. It can be a heart or heart print fabric.

Quilt must be started during this calendar year-2023

The challenge is open to guild members only

There will be four (4) categories:

Large — (40X40 or larger)

Small — (less than 40X40)

Other — Wearable Art clothing, placemats, totes and bags, etc

Original — This is for any quilted item that is your original design and not purchased or otherwise copied from someone else. This is your opportunity to let your creativity shine.
