Please make arrangements with me if you plan on dropping off at my house or if you would like to drop off your item on December 30th.

On January 2nd at our regular meeting we will have all entries on display for your viewing and voting. The maker of each item will be anonymous and each item will be numbered. There will be five categories for voting: Large, Small, Other, Original, and Best of Show. As the votes are tallied I will ask each of you to say something about your creation.
