- Large (40X40 or larger)
- Small (less than 40X40)
- Other Wearable Art clothing, placemats, totes and bags, etc
- Original This is for any quilted item that is your original design and not purchased or otherwise copied from someone else. This is your opportunity to let your creativity shine.
