

#### **Programs**

Sue Marin and Katrina Idleman

March 5, 2024 Program (Hybrid – In Person and Zoom) -- Dana Jones, Pagtinabangay: The Quilts and Quiltmakers of Caohagan Island



Dana Jones first identified herself as a quilter on September 14, 2003. Her professional roots as a journalist pinned the date, and the impact of attending a three-day Martha Pullen quilt event in Huntsville, Alabama eventually led to a second career in the world of quilting. Dana served as editor and head of Quilters Newsletter magazine and editor of SAQA Journal (Studio Art Quilt Associates), before stepping away to research and write her book Pagtinabangay: The Quilts and Quiltmakers of Caohagan Island.

Caohagan is a tiny island in the Philippines on which the Pagtinabangay art quilting style has emerged. Pagtinabangay translates to "working together". Over one hundred men and women of Caohagan Island produce and sell art quilts to support themselves. The community spirit of cooperation has led to beautiful quilts with stories to tell. Join us in March to share in that spirit!



April 2, 2024 – Patricia Belyae, "The Alluring World of Japanese Yukata Quilts" – Hybrid meeting. Patricia Belyea made her first quilt at age 53 from garments purchased at Goodwill. She felt that she had found a home in quilting. She discovered yukata cottons during travels to Japan. A yukata is a lightweight, informal, Japanese kimono whose name translates to "bathing cloth". Yukata were historically worn to local bathhouses. Today, yukata are widely worn as casual summer garb. Modern yukata fabrics have strayed from the traditional indigo and white to lively multicolored designs. Patricia's Zoom lecture will lead us into "The Alluring World of Japanese Yukata Quilts." When not lecturing or teaching workshops, Patricia and her daughter Victoria Stone are the owners of Okan ("mom" in Japanese) Arts. Their West Coast business imports vintage textiles from Japan, runs quilting workshops, leads tours to Japan, and offers quilts by Patricia in its online gallery.









**April 27, 2024 - WORKSHOP** – Heather Blokzyl will teach Barn Quilt painting at Calvary. Three patterns will be available. \$50/person. All materials included. Live program only.

May 7, 2024 - Barbara Dann of Alleycat Quilts will do a live lecture and trunk show.

May 8, 2024 - WORKSHOP -- Technique Class - Barbara returns on Wednesday morning to teach the Snail's Trail technique. This live technique class is fun and rewarding. You'll finish a block within the allotted three-hour class.

June 4, 2024 – Lisa Shepard Stewart – Sewing with African Fabrics. Live lecture, truck show and "retail therapy" opportunity.

**July 2, 2024** - Brita Nelson, also known as "The Questioning Quilter," will do a live lecture, "Now You See It, Now You Don't: The Magic of Disappearing Blocks".

July 20, 2024 - WORKSHOP - Brita returns for a live, six-hour workshop – The Disappearing Block Sampler. At the end of the day, you will have completed nine blocks.

August 6, 2024 – End the year with our Crazy Quilters' version of the Mad Hatter's Unbirthday Party. Everyone gets to celebrate! In-person only.

Article 13. Amendments These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of The Guild by the vote of twothirds of the members present, provided that the proposed amendment(s) has been submitted in writing at the prior regular meeting and has been published as part of The Guild newsletter.
