She grew up in Central Pennsylvania with parents and siblings who nurtured her creative spirit since she was little. When her mom opened a quilt shop, she was captivated by the sense of community that this inspiring art form fostered. Having spent her childhood wandering the aisles, teaching classes, and witnessing the exciting growth of this business, she knew she wanted to be a part of it! Her goal is to keep the tradition alive with a careful balance of preservation and innovation.



Rachel's business embodies the idea of "tradition gone moders," Why? Because quilting and sewing have touched her life and brought her into deep relationships with women across generations. This is so important to Rachel, that she doesn't want her children and grandchildren to miss out on the opportunity.

Although Diane rarely picts up a needle, she has created more than 300 original quilts within her paintings. Diane often describes her art as "Quilting with a paintbrush." Best known for her popular Americana quilt series, a vibrant collection of paintings featuring flowers, cottages, country stores, and Amish country life with a rainbow of quilts hanging from porch rails, clotheslines, and fences, Diane's goal is to convey to collectors of her art the smell of spring flowers, the warmth of a

summer day, the mood of an autumn sky, or a winter sunset and the peace and contentment of nature and her Pennsylvania heritage.

Diane has also written several books, including "Quilts from a Painter's Art: 28 quilts and Bonus Projects". In addition to sharing her painting journey with us, Diane will have items for sale that evening.

Quilt Challenge 2025

The challenge this year will be to make a "Monochromatic" quilted piece. The definition of Monochromatic is having or consisting of one color or hue. You can use a variety of shades of a single color or hue. OR, you can

use black, white and grey. To make it more interesting you may optionally add one additional color. The added color may only be used in less than 10% of the piece. The fabrics used may be solid, blenders or patterns, but the overwhelming color in each fabric should be the selected monochromatic or added color.

For example, if you choose

- black, white, and gray, you could optionally add lime green in less than 10% of the piece
- teal, you could optionally add black in less than 10% of the piece
- red, you could optionally add white in less than 10% of the piece
- blue, you could optionally add orange in less than 10% of the piece

Note: to get more information on monochromatic color schemes, google the color you want to use, for example 'monochromatic red color schemes'

All entries will have a quilter's statement about the piece and must be completed between February 4 and December 27, 2025.

There will be four categories

- Large Quilt (40" X 40" or larger)
- Small Quilt (less than 40" X 40")
- Other (placemats, totes, garments. Wearable art, etc.)
- Original (any product, quilt or otherwise, that was not a purchased
 pattern created by someone else. This must come out of your own imagination. If your product was
 inspired by another creator, please give them credit).

labeled, and priced. Diana has further instructions elsewhere in this newsletter. Please call if you have any concerns.

If an item is not listed above or there is a ? after it, label and price as you would like. If pricing needs adjusting, we will deal with it as we get to it. Also anything that does not sell will be heading to a donation center (Wooden Bridge or some other place that sews for charity). If you want your donation back instead of being donated, please grab it when the show is completed.

Mystery Bags Diana Defanti

I will be accepting usable fabric scraps up to fat eighths size for mystery bags for the show. They will be pressed, sorted by color or theme, weighed and put in bags. Please go thru your fabric that you THOUGHT you would use but have not as yet. They will make someone else very happy and make money for the guild.


