Nov 4th – Quilt Turning at the Schwenkfelder Museum in Pennsburg

Registration for the upcoming Quilt Turning of quilts from the Goshenhoppen Historians collection is now open. It's Nov 4, with 2 sessions -- 10 to noon and 1 to 3. The turning is being held at Schwenkfelder Museum in Pennsburg (their meeting room is more easily accessible for visitors). Nancy Roan and her husband were founding members of the Goshenhoppens and were the authors of Lest I Shall Be Forgotten, and she was in charge of their textile collection for many years. The quilts on exhibit were made by Nancy who loved designing and applique. The quilts in the turning
