Original — This is for any quilted item that is your original design and not purchased or otherwise copied from someone else. This is your opportunity to let your creativity shine.

Submission deadline is December 22. More details on the deadline in the future.

Nov 4th – Quilt Turning at the Schwenkfelder Museum in Pennsburg

Registration for the upcoming Quilt Turning of quilts from the Goshenhoppen Historians collection is now open. It's Nov 4, with 2 sessions -- 10 to noon and 1 to 3. The turning is being held at Schwenkfelder Museum in Pennsburg (their meeting room is more easily accessible for visitors). Nancy Roan and her husband were founding members of the Goshenhoppens and were the authors of Lest I Shall Be Forgotten, and she was in charge of their textile collection for many years. The quilts on exhibit were made by Nancy who loved designing and applique. The quilts in the turning date from 1840s to 1940 and include one with Prussian Blue and one with a pillar print between rows of flying geese. Plus a great assortment of local style PA German quilts.
