

## **Monthly Challenge**

If you participated in the Monthly challenge for last month-flying geese-I hope you enjoyed it! At our upcoming October meeting, I can't wait to see what you made. I do hope you felt the challenge was worthwhile.

For October, our challenge topic is to make "something tiny". "Tiny" is a somewhat objective term and might be defined differently by each person. Our challenge will include all of the definitions. For example, if you usually make 12" blocks, something tiny to you might be a 6" block. If you usually make 6" blocks, something tiny to you might be a 3" or 4" block. All of these are acceptable and the tinier the better!

Your "tiny" item can be one block, a pin cushion, a mini quilt, etc... You get to decide what you make and what you turn it into. In my experience I have found that tiny piecing greatly improves an individual's quilt piecing skills. Once you take the time to make something tiny, then go back to the regular size blocks that you typically make, the blocks seem easier and more doable.

I encourage you all to set a little time aside and make something tiny! Since we do not meet in person in November, we will show our items for the October challenge at the December meeting.

#### **Guild Quilt**

Thank you very much to those that volunteered to make a block! The blocks that have already been returned to me all look FANTASTIC! If you have a bag, please bring the completed block to me at the October meeting. We do not meet in person in November, and I would like to start assembling the quilt in the month of November.

#### Instructional Sit 'n Sews

There are 4 Sit & Sews left in 2024. We have two in October- the 5th and 19th and two in November- the 2nd and the 16th.

October 5th- The instructional topic is making a Fabric Key Fob. If you would like to participate in this, please email me and let me know by September 30th- Jessica Dayon. I will let you know what supplies to bring. The pattern for this is a free tutorial by Alli Jenson of Woodberry Way. These make great holiday gifts and stocking stuffers. Making the key fobs will only take a small portion of the Sit & Sew. We will start at 10:30 and then afterward, it will be a free sew. If no one signs up, then this Sit & Sew will be a regular free sew.



October 19th- free sew only, no instructional topic

November 2nd- free sew only, no instructional topic

November 16th- For this Sit & Sew, the topic is Christmas themed string quilts. For this, each person who participates, will need to bring a bag of Christmas themed strings/strips. We will all work on our own individual string quilt blocks and rotate bags of strings/strips every 15- 20 minutes. This way we will all have a little bit of each other's fabric in our own quilts. I will provide string quilt ideas beforehand so that you can prepare for the type of string quilt that you would like to make. If you like to participate in this, please email me and let me know by November 5th-Jessica Dayon. If no one signs up, then this Sit & Sew will be a regular free sew.

#### **Programs**

<u>September 28 and 29, 2024</u> – **Global Quilt Connection's Sampler Platter** via **Zoom** only. Eighteen amazing teachers will demonstrate a new technique or creative tip with you, all in the comfort of your own home. Demonstrations run each day from 3:00 – 6:00 PM EST. A link to this FREE event and the materials lists will be forwarded to you after the September meeting. This is for Crazy Quilters only and the information may not be shared or distributed outside the Guild.

October 1, 2024 – David Sirota, aka Quilt Maven Dave, will present "What Makes a Quilter Tick: A Fun-Filled Look in the Mirror."



October 2, 2024 – **David Sirota** returns to teach his "No More Tears" method of paper piecing using his "Scrapy Chevron Star...Or Not" pattern. Class runs from 10 AM – 4 PM with one hour for lunch. Registration is \$35 for class. There is one spot left for this class! Please make

registration checks payable to Crazy Quilters' Quilt Guild. A \$5 kit fee is required the day of class. Dave asks that you pay in cash or by check made payable to him. Doors will open at 9:00 AM to allow time for everyone to set up their sewing machine and get materials ready. Extension cords are highly recommended. Bring your lunch and don't forget the dental floss!



November 5, 2024 – Lyric Montgomery Kinard, artist and cofounder of the Global Quilt Connection will share "Living Lyrically: Be Inspired, Create Beauty, Find Joy" via Zoom. (This is a ZOOM ONLY meeting as it is election night and Calvary is not available as a meeting site.) Lyric will share her "circuitous and unexpected path towards life as a quilt artist." She is sure to make us laugh as she juggles family and fabric while dealing with duties and dreams. But the lecture is mostly about YOU. Where you are right now is the best place to start. In the end, you'll be better equipped to create your own beauty.

#### Sewing Around the World - In Poland



Lorraine Bujnowski and her husband traveled to Poland this September. Outside their hotel located in Krakow, next to the town square, they saw a white tent being erected. Will there be a wedding or a flower show? The next day to their amazement it was filled with sewing machines, tables and about 50 young women seated and sewing their hearts out. They were making pillowcases for the three

children's hospitals in Krakow. Lorraine immediately said that she had to participate with this enthusiastic group. She said to one of the Englishspeaking leaders "we do this in my country as well". Lorraine found a vacant



machine and began to sew. The leader said that they made 1000 pillowcases in one day last year. It appears that women all over the world are eager to share their knowledge and skills and are willing to donate their time to brighten a child's world.

And while in Warsaw, Lorraine passed a craft show in and found these beautiful quilts at one of the vendor stands.


