October 7, 2025 – Susan Suhre, a Berks County resident, shares her lovely, appliqued quilts, many of which have

won prizes at major shows. Her trunk show will include 40 or more of her creations. You'll be able to get a close up look at them. "Susan has had judges' comments praising her hand applique, and it's done by machine. She won the best applique at the NQA show in Columbus (when it was still in business) as well as best applique at the Vermont Quilt Show."



Sue has agreed to do an in-person six-hour workshop on Saturday, October 25th when she'll teach us her invisible machine applique technique. Details and registration for Sue's class are now open.

During Susan's class, we will cover smooth curves, stems, circles, and inner and outer points as well as stitch selection, tension, threads, etc. The only true requirements students need are a

machine that does a blanket stitch and monofilament thread. Some of the materials will be provided by the instructor. Complete materials lists will be provided once payment has been received. In addition to your fabric, it is recommended that you have a glue pen like Sewline or Fons and Porter.

This is a full day workshop beginning at 9:00 AM and ending at 4:00 PM on Saturday, October 25, 2025. We will meet here at Calvary. The morning of the class is dedicated to preparing the applique pieces. You won't need your machine until after lunch. The fee for this class is \$40. Checks should be made payable to Crazy Quilters' Quilt Guild. Registration is open and space is limited. Cassandra Kriley and Sue Marin will be taking reservations at our meeting in September. Look for one of us at the Program table when you sign in for the meeting. The deadline to register is October 14, 2025.

Participants will learn the quilt-as-you-go method, do some hand stitching to add a sleek, linear element, and choose from various finishing techniques. If you've thought of giving the modern genre a try but didn't want to delve into a huge project, this little project might be just what you need to get inspired!

The challenge this year will be to make a "Monochromatic" quilted piece. The definition of Monochromatic is having or consisting of one color or hue. You can use a variety of shades of a single color or hue. OR, you can use black, white and grey. To make it more interesting you may optionally add one additional color. The added color may only be used in less than 10% of the piece. The fabrics used may be solid, blenders or patterns, but the overwhelming color in each fabric should be the selected monochromatic or added color. So, you can bring completed pillowcases to any monthly meeting, and we'll deliver them.

Upcoming opportunities to work together on CQQG's Community Service projects:

At October 7th's monthly meeting, you can sign out precut kits to make pillowcases, preemie blankets, preemie bears and/or placemats at home. From 5-6:30 pm, before the meeting starts, help make kits by cutting donated fabric that we'll bring.



Starting at 11 am until about 3 pm at October 18th's Sit and Sew at Faith Presbyterian and at November 1st's Community Service Sewcial at Calvary Baptist, from 9 am - 3 pm, we'll have donated fabric and setup a mini assembly line process for anyone who wants to help make preemie blankets, preemie bears, or Meals on Wheels placemats, whether or not you've made them before and whether or not you bring a sewing machine.

Since November's monthly meeting is online only, please remember to **bring completed placemats and unwanted calendars for Meals on Wheels of the Greater Lehigh Valley (MOWGLV) to one of these events** because we'll drop off our annual donation of these items in early November. Of course, you can make placemats anytime, but please hold onto any you make after November 1st because MOWGLV only collects and distributes them once a year.
