Finished quilt = 67" x 79"

Finished Blocks for Quilt = 12" Square

Unfinished Blocks for Quilt = 12 1/2" Square

Purchase the Quilt Kit from www.AbbiMays.com

All seams a scant 1/4"
Press in the direction of the arrows

Block #2 Part #1 - "Stockyard Star" Quilt Block



The fabrics can get confusing because they run from lights to darks & everything in between. So here's the fabrics go into this quilt block & the numbers associated with them:



Cream



Sandcastle



Leather & Lace



Mellow Yellow



Black









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Block #2 Part #1 - Cutting Requirements for FIVE (5) "Stockyard Star" Quilt Blocks



"Stockyard Star" Quilt Block Make a total of FIVE (5)

	Mellow Yellow - Color #10	Cut FIVE (5) 3 1/2" squares.
7	Cream - Color #7	Cut TEN (10) 4 1/4" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, TWO (2) times. You will end up with FOUR (4) triangles per square.
	Sandcastle - Color #8	Cut TEN (10) 2 1/2" squares. On the back side of the squares draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time.
	Sandcastle - Color #8	Cut TWENTY (20) 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles.
	Leather & Lace - Color #9	Cut TWENTY (20) 2 1/2" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You will end up with TWO (2) triangles per square.
	Black - Color #6	Cut TWENTY (20) 3 1/2" squares.
	Black - Color #6	Cut TEN (10) 2 1/2" squares.
	Black - Color #6	Cut TWENTY (20) 2 1/2" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You will end up with TWO (2) triangles per square.
	Black - Color #6	Cut FIVE (5) 7 1/4" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, TWO (2) times. You will end up with FOUR (4) triangles per square.

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

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Block #2 Part #1 - Piecing the "Stockyard Star" Quilt Blocks Together



"Stockyard Star"
Quilt Block
Make a total of FIVE (5)

Half-Square Triangle (HST) Tutorial



Blue line = Drawn line
Red dashed line = Sew 1/4" on EACH
SIDE of the drawn line

Place the Sandcastle 2 1/2" square on the Black 2 1/2" square (right sides together) and sew 1/4" on EACH SIDE of the line you drew (Figure #1). Then cut the half-square triangles apart ON the line you drew. You will end up with TWO (2) half-square triangles (Figure #2) for a total of TWENTY (20). Press toward the darkest fabric. Clip your corners (aka dog ears).



Quilt Note: When making HST's, try cutting your squares 1/4" or 1/2" larger than the pattern calls for, then trim them down to the exact size needed for your quilt block. In the case of the "Stockyard Star" quilt block, the exact finished size should be 2" square.

Flying Geese Tutorial

You will see on my instructions to either cut some squares one time or two times. Both of them diagonally, corner-to-corner. When piecing Flying Geese for the "Stockyard Star" quilt block, follow Diagram #1 on the right first (sewing the TWO (2) smaller Leather & Lace triangles to the same-sized Black triangles.

Then sew the Cream triangles to the Leather & Lace + Black triangles (Diagram #2).





Then follow Diagram #3 on the right (sewing the larger Black triangle to the newly created Leather & Lace/Black/Cream triangles).

Quilt Note: Sometimes it's best to press your Flying Geese seams open. Use your discretion to make the best decision for your quilt top.

This pattern has been tested, to the best of our ability. If your block does not come out the size shown, please try adjusting your needle position to the appropriate position (left or right) to see if you get the correct block size.

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


Block #2 Part #1 - Piecing the "Stockyard Star" Quilt Blocks Together (cont.)


