We'll experience my good, bad and AH HA moments as Cyndi learned how to work with the different styles of panels and how adding interesting block treatments and borders and filling those pesky open spaces with patchwork or appliqué results in a truly special quilt. **February 4, 2026** -- Workshop: Panel Palooza- 6 hour workshop via ZOOM with Cyndi McChesney

In this workshop, quilters will take the panel that they fell in love with and turn it into something truly unique. We'll discuss how to uncover design inspiration, square up your panel sections, add interesting block treatments and borders and cover the basics of graphing, adding coping strips, and more, all guaranteed to make your panel project a success.

#### March 2, 2026 - March 3, 2026- Joyce Hughes- "My Journey into Quilting"



This is a very open and inspiring talk about how I started quilting, leading into Art Quilts with Thread Painting. Finishing with ideas to use with Panels as Art Quilts. Many people leave very excited and enthused to try something new with their quilting. My main subject matter will be working with fabric panels. Showing many "Before and After's". Exploring how panels can be used on personal projects. Many panels are looked at and passed over. I often hear, "What do you do with this? It is so big, The colors are dull, etc., etc.". With added thread painting on the fabric, and possible additional embellishments, the project soon becomes a

piece of Art! Learn about the preparation of the panel for the project and explore the freedom of using thread painting. This shows how the layering of threads lets you achieve the different effects on the quilts. Then, add embellishments of ribbons, fabric markers, crystals, etc. The panel/project is now unique and One of a Kind!

## April 7, 2026- Jamie Davis- Loopy Tulip Designs- "History and Mystery of Baltimore Album Quilts"

The history of Baltimore Album quilts is a fascinating journey into an America headed for the Civil War. Discover how the industrial revolution, the struggle over slavery and the social and moral climate of the time contributed to this beautiful art form. Through stories, Jaimie will explore how the demise of Baltimore Album quilts leads us into the hearts and minds of the women who made them, and find out how a pregnancy, a Christmas gift and a quilt class gone horribly wrong helps to explain the mystery behind why these quilts disappeared almost overnight. It's a funny, provocative and insightful look into some of America's most beautiful treasures.

#### Quilt Challenge 2025 -- IT'S ALMOST TIME!

The challenge this year will be to make a "Monochromatic" quilted piece. The definition of Monochromatic is having or consisting of one color or hue. You can use a variety of shades of a single color or hue. OR, you can use black, white and grey. To make it more interesting you may optionally add one additional color. The added color may only be used in less than 10% of the piece. The fabrics used may be solid, blenders or patterns, but the overwhelming color in each fabric should be the selected monochromatic or added color. For example, if you choose

- black, white and gray, you could optionally add lime green in less than 10% of the piece
- teal, you could optionally add black in less than 10% of the piece
- red, you could optionally add white in less than 10% of the piece
- blue, you could optionally add red in less than 10% of the piece

All entries will have a quilter's statement about the piece and must be completed between February 4 and December 27, 2025.

There will be four categories:

- Large Quilt (40" X 40" or larger)
- Small Quilt (less than 40" X 40")
- Other (placemats, totes, garments. Wearable art, etc.)
- Original (any product, quilt or otherwise, that was not a purchased pattern created by someone else.
   This must come out of your own imagination. If your product was inspired by another creator, please give them credit).

1st, 2nd and 3rd place prizes will be awarded for each category. One prize will be awarded for Best of Show. Quilters will be asked to stand near their entry as prizes are awarded for each category. Members are encouraged to submit more than one entry but only one entry per category. For example, one large, one small, and one original.

To submit your entry, please follow these instructions:

- Cover any labels that identify you
- If you don't want pins used to secure your entry to a bulletin board,
   please attach a 4-inch sleeve so it can be hung by a dowel
- Place your submission inside a pillowcase or opaque bag
- Fill out the submission form. Pin the top portion to the pillowcase/bag, put the bottom portion inside the pillowcase/bag with your entry

**Note:** to get more information on monochromatic color schemes, google the color you want to use, for example 'monochromatic red color schemes'

Multiple techniques may be used such as appliqué, collage, foundation paper piecing, English paper piecing, pixelating, mosaic, embellishments, etc.


Recently, we learned that, in addition to breast cancer comfort pillows, Cancer Support Community of the Greater Lehigh Valley would also like port pillows.


